

Pastoral Letter November 2022

Friends,

As I write this it's not yet feeling too close to Christmas – the last of the Hallowe'en clearance items are still on the shelves – but no doubt we'll be surrounded by Christmas music very soon, and I'd imagine certainly by the time this comes through your door.

It's not that I'm a 'Grinch' about Christmas, or that I'm particularly keen to indulge in that tired old moan about how early things begin, though I have my fair share of doubts around some of the consumerist tendencies that advertising encourages us towards at this time of year, it's more that I personally quite like the time of *advent*, the period of watching and waiting in preparation for the miracle celebrated at Christmas.

In Christian tradition of years past (and theoretically still today in church traditions where the observances of the Christian year are observed solemnly) the season of advent was a time of fasting and waiting, just like Lent before Easter. Partly I reckon this dovetailed well with the rhythm of the agricultural year, after the time of harvest feasting comes the winter where all that is available is what food can be stored longer term and preserved. In such seasons there are very practical reasons for fasting and 'tightening the belt', so that the foodstores see folk through winter. Traditions come and go, and our world feeds itself differently now – able to transport all manner of things globally whatever the season locally. The idea of advent as fasting time is a long way from the season it has become: shops full of Christmas treats, chocolates, rich food - and I'm as prone as anyone to indulge in the gluttony of it all!

And yet, there's that poignant awareness always, the knowledge that whilst some have plenty, when TV adverts feature table-set feasts brimming over – so many folk go through a Christmas of real hardship.

The problems causing the cost-of-living crisis (which for many is not the start of new difficulty, but a further deepening of struggles that have been years in the making) are deep and complex. Whilst it ought to be clear to politicians that it's amongst the most urgent set of issues for action, it is also for us to show kindness, generosity and solidarity within our own communities too.

So I wonder about the thought of advent as a season of fasting. And I wonder about the gift of simplicity: of being freed from some of the pressures and expectations we put ourselves under at Christmas. At the heart of the Christmas story is not a set of people who 'have it all' – but a new family, alone in an unfamiliar place, with no comfort to nurse a newborn except the animals' byre. To anyone looking on, it is a dire situation of need and anxiety. And yet, the heart of Christmas is the upside-down truth that in *that* situation, the Light of the World is born: God's light and love is precisely for a world of shadow and need.

I think the advent hymn by Kathy Galloway captures it well:

When out of poverty is born a dream that will not die, and landless, weary folk find strength to stand with heads held high, it's then we learn from those who wait to greet the promised day, 'The Lord is coming; don't lose heart. Be blest; prepare the way!'

This advent, Christmas, and beyond: may you know light and love. God bless you in all things.

Winter Walks

Welcome to our 2022/23 Winter walks! Aberlour Parish Church Walking Group is a friendly group, open to all (members and non-members). Children are welcome, and so are dogs, under adult supervision. Please bring packed lunch for these walks (excluding the December walk) and wear walking boots or strong shoes. Come ready to start the walks at 11am. <u>Sat 10th December 2022: Dufftown – Giant's Chair and Meg's Widd Circular (8km / 5m)</u>

Our traditional Christmas walk. We will meet at Dufftown Square / top of Balvenie Street. Both Long and Short Walks go from Dufftown Square by the pleasant riverside path to the Giant's Chair on the Dullan Burn, and then back to Mortlach Kirk. The Short Walk (5km) goes directly back to the Square by road while the Long Walk returns by Meg's Widd. Christmas lunch (well, soup and sandwiches) have been arranged at the Commercial Hotel in Dufftown. Please confirm by 28th November if you wish to join us for lunch to allow us to confirm numbers with the Hotel.

Sat 14th January 2023: Aberlour circular via Glenallachie (7km / 4m) Another local walk... We will walk from Aberlour Church along the Speyside Way to Delmore Farm, take the wide track to Kinnermony, cross the A95 and proceed to Glenallachie. Then we follow the Lour Burn to the Linn falls, and take the path back to Aberlour.

Sat 11th February 2023: Carron to Ballindalloch Station linear (11.5km / 7m).

We will park some cars at Ballindalloch Station, and return to Carron to start the walk. The walk follows the Speyside Way South, taking in Knockando and Tamdhu distilleries, stopping for lunch at the hook. The walk continues to Ballindalloch Station, before driving back to Carron to pick up the cars.

Sat 12th March 2023: Cromdale to Easter Rynaballoch (Circular) (8km / 5m)

Postponed from October 2022... We will park at the Cromdale football pitch car park (NJ 076 286) and walk along the Speyside Way to Easter Pollowick, before crossing the road and walking on the track to Easter Rynaballoch and then to Wester Rynaballoch, before returning through the forest, retracing our steps to Cromdale.


You may remember in the last Kirk News, we mentioned the outcome of the first "Information evening" in June, where the attendees discussed the aims and vision of the community garden, and the zones they would like to see. We held a picnic in the glebe in mid-August, where the community could experience the glebe. A third, "Next Steps" meeting was held in the Church in November to involve the community in preparing the forward plan. The focus was on looking more closely at some of the zones:

- A meeting place for meditation with benches, tables, and open spaces
- A recreation area with space for exercise
- A kids' fun area with a safe play area,
- An environment area (pond, wildlife area, beehives)
- A growing area (orchards, fruit bushes, raised beds, polytunnels)

These "quick-wins" will allow us to establish a garden for the 2023 growing season. The Aberlour Parish Church Glebe Land includes the main field and river bank to the North.

SCIO CRAIGELLACHIE VILLAGE COUNCIL SCO18399

The Christmas Lights sub-committee has been working hard to research and purchase lights for the village lamp posts on the A941. We will be appealing for volunteers to help erect the lights so please keep an eye on our Facebook page for more information. The observant amongst you may have noticed a blue shipping container situated at the edge of the woodland on Spey Road, and this container will be used to store the lights during the year. Thanks to the Christmas lights sub-committee for their work and also to Gavin Strathdee of Strathdee Properties who cleared and levelled the site for the container.

The new path linking the Highlander Park carpark and the Speyside Way has attracted many favourable comments. A concrete plinth and e-bike shelter has been installed and it is expected the e-bikes will be ready for use in spring 2023. Security lighting will also be provided at the pavilion, plus signage reminding cyclists to be aware of children playing. Signs warning users of the path of pedestrians crossing have already been positioned on the Speyside Way at the approaches to the playpark entrance. Another improvement to the Highlander Park is the new picnic bench under the trees adjacent to the car park.

The tennis courts got a spruce up during the early summer but, on closer inspection, the surrounding fencing, tennis net posts and tarmac surface are in need of upgrading. What do you, the community of Craigellachie, think of our tennis courts? Do you use them and how often? Is there anything else you would like to see in it's place? What do you think about converting it to a multi-use, all-weather space with different lines marked out, i.e. not only tennis court markings, but also basketball, 5 a-side football and netball markings? Let us know what you think via Facebook or speak to a committee member.

One of the final tasks following the completion of the hall extension was to improve the hall car park to make it more disabled and wheelchair friendly. Gavin Strathdee rose to the challenge of digging out and levelling the carpark and laying several tonnes of stone chips to create a clean and mud free entrance into the new disabled hall entrance. We are very fortunate that Gavin not only lives in the village and has access to the plant and machinery for these types of tasks, but also that he is willing to undertake the work on a voluntary basis – grateful thanks to Gavin for his willingness, time and skills.

Just like everyone else, the village council is having to deal with increased energy bills. The recent estimated bill for lighting the Craigellachie Bridge was too high to justify "keeping the lights on", and we regrettably announced the lights would be switched off. Fortunately, Macallan Distillery came forward

The lack of progress in improvement to the Fiddich Park is very frustrating for both residents and visitors to the village. The Fiddich Park is an asset to both Moray Council, the Craigellachie community and the wider Speyside area, and during the coming months/years we would like to work alongside Moray Council to create a Park Management Plan.
