## Hello from the Manse!

This edition of Kirk News is arriving to you during Christian Aid week. You will likely be familiar with the annual envelope appeal of Christian Aid and I'll say a little more about it below. But first the exciting news that as Christian Aid week starts on May 12<sup>th</sup>, we'll be welcoming the Head of Christian Aid in Scotland, Val Brown, to lead worship in Craigellachie and Aberlour – please do come and hear Val speak about the inspirational work of this amazing organisation which works with those experiencing extreme poverty worldwide, regardless of faith.

I want also to say a huge thank you to those who have supported Christian Aid in the past: you support genuinely life-saving and life-changing work across the world, through a charity which works directly with partners in the areas it works. Christian Aid has been a world leader in sustainable development for over 75 years and is also a member of the alliance of charitable organisations known as the Disaster Emergency Committee, who are often the first and best placed organisations to respond to emergency crises across the world.

As a church, we've supported Christian Aid's recent disaster appeals, in Ukraine; in Turkey; in Syria; and throughout advent last year, the Middle East as the conflict in Gaza continues to cause some of the most difficult humanitarian conditions of recent decades. As I write this, at least a month before you'll read it, the headlines tell the story of 3 British aid workers killed in Gaza while attempting to deliver food supplies. We are thankful for the courage and humanity of those who work in disaster relief, and we long for an end to conflict.

Alongside Christian Aid's disaster relief work is their ongoing development work, which often focuses on improving the resilience of communities where our changing world makes life very difficult. Major focuses of Christian Aid's work include the effects of climate chaos, ending gender-based violence, and empowering people with the tools they need to create sustainable livelihoods.

This year the story profiled is of Aline in Burundi, central Africa. In Burundi, malnourishment and poverty affect more than 70% of the population, making survival a daily struggle. Jobs and food are hard to come by, and those who have homes often have no electricity or running water.

For Aline, life was a constant struggle. She was married young and gave birth to her eldest son, Fisto, when she was just 14 years old. Aline experienced constant abuse at the hands of her violent husband. A few years later, Aline faced even

more devastation. Her husband married another woman, forcing Aline to flee. He prevented her from taking their children with her, and in a further act of cruelty, told the local community that Aline was mentally ill and unable to care for her children.

Through Christian Aid, Aline was taught how to form a Village Savings and Loans Association (VSLA) and establish a steady income. VSLAs mean people can save for their future and borrow money to kickstart small rural businesses. With all she had learned, Aline started a small business selling peanuts and avocados: soon, her dream of getting her children back finally felt possible.

Today, Aline lives peacefully on her own plot of land in a remote village in the Kayogoro Commune in Makamba Province. She's baked her own bricks and is building a strong home for her and her children in every sense. Now Aline can afford food, clothes and essential healthcare for her family. She's also purchased solar panels so her children can do their evening homework by electric light.

Giving what you can this week to Christian Aid will help people like Aline, and countless others, in parts of the world where lives and livelihoods can be transformed with a bit of support.

Wishing you well – and for a peaceful flourishing summer. God's blessing be with you and yours,

## **ROGER JONES**

It is forty years since Roger and his wife, Mary, set up Christian Music Ministries, based in Birmingham. It was a brave decision for Roger to give up a steady job teaching music in a secondary school, and it was a decision that arose from the couple's strong faith. Roger is a composer who has written many musicals of well known stories from the Bible. He and his team also travel around the U.K. giving performances of the musicals, leading worship, music workshops and residential courses.

"Musical Man" is a presentation which takes the form of a Q & A interview, with the Rev Andrew Kimmitt asking the questions and Roger openly talking about his life, his ministry, the challenges and the joys along the way. Some of his music will illustrate the talk. Maureen Anderson's Kirk Singers have performed many of Roger's musicals and we are delighted that several of her singers will be singing with Roger again.

Roger's story is fascinating and "Musical Man" promises to be a very interesting, enjoyable and motivating evening. 5

### Car Share

2024 will be a very exciting year for the Car Share as we celebrate 20 years of being a registered charity. The Scheme was originally established in the year 2000 and operated from Tomintoul under the name of the Transport Group, however it ran into financial difficulties in 2003 and the committee had little option but to take the difficult decision to discontinue the Scheme until they could secure the funding needed to operate effectively. The individuals who got involved in taking things forward looked at what could be done differently and simply "rolled up their sleeves" to do what was necessary to get things up and running again in a viable way. A new Management Committee was formed and, along with the Coordinator and Secretary, they were able to get the Scheme registered as a Scottish Charity. There was pressure from some to get things up and running as quickly as possible and by all accounts a degree of pessimism that it may never happen, but others understood that a more cautious approach was needed to get the Scheme on a stronger financial footing before starting up again. After 18 months of hard work, perseverance and determination they were successful in securing the funding required and the Scheme was officially relaunched on the 18th of May 2004 as "Speyside Community Car Sharing Scheme". Over the last 20 years we have been fortunate to have had support from so many volunteers and funders and have grown from having 50 members and 13 volunteers at the end of the first year to currently having 530 members and 31 volunteers.

We are so grateful for the time our volunteer drivers, telephonists and Committee give up to make sure our members can make their journeys. We are desperately keen to welcome more volunteer drivers to our team, as it is more efficient for us to use a driver as close as possible to the member and we have a few of our current volunteers unavailable at present due to health problems. It is a very flexible way of volunteering as we don't ask for any regular commitment from our drivers and they give whatever time they can spare - even an hour or so every now and again is a huge help to us. Our telephonists also play a vital part in the efficient running of the Scheme, so if you are at home one day a week and would be able to take calls from our members and help organise their journeys please get in touch. This could be on a fixed day each week, or simply helping out to cover holidays or illness on a day you're free. You don't need any equipment, just access to a phone (landline or mobile) and I divert the calls to your number.

We have secured funding towards our costs for the next financial year and thank Berry Burn Community Fund, Corra Foundation, Paul's Hill Windfarm, Rothes Windfarm, National Lottery Community Fund and TSI Mental Health & Wellbeing Fund for their support. We are also grateful to the many individuals, businesses and organisations who have made donations to us this last year. We plan to hold our own fundraising events throughout our  $20^{th}$  anniversary year and if any local business would like donate a raffle prize please get in touch. I'm looking forward to sharing further details of these events in the next newsletter and in the meantime look out for updates on our website and Facebook page.

It's hard to believe that less than 4 years ago, The Rothes Way Association came into being at a meeting held in my back garden, as inside events were banned due to covid. Eight months later, in April 2021, the project was kick started by G & A Construction, part of the Forsyth Group of companies, resurfacing the first part of the old railway line, from the top of Land Street, up to the Bulwark, free of charge.

The resurfacing of the second section of the railway line, taking us up to opposite Dandaleith Cottages, was completed last year and things are well underway in getting the necessary agreements plans etc. in place for the next section, which will finally link Rothes and Craigellachie with a multi use path. We are grateful to Edrington for scraping back the vegetation on the old "branch" road leading from Macallan brae down to the access road to the Telford Bridge

# Aberlour Walking Group Summer 2024 Walks

Welcome to our 2024 Summer walks. Aberlour Walking Group is a welcoming group, open to everybody in the community. Our aim is to combine walking with an opportunity to meet and chat with other walkers, and to introduce walkers to some new areas. Children are welcome, and so are dogs, under adult supervision. We usually stop for a quick tea/coffee en route, so please bring a flask and wear walking boots or strong shoes. Come ready to start the walks at 9:30am. If you need more information or help with transport please contact Donald (contact details below). Please confirm with Donald that you are coming on any walk.

# 25<sup>th</sup> May 2024: Allan Reid to Knochkan (circular) (12.5km / 7.75m, 170m ascent).

This one may be squelchy! We will park at the Allan Reid car park near Tomnavoulin and follow the River Livet to Knochkan bothy passing many ruined bothies. At Knochkan there is an option to walk up to Suie bothy. We return by a slightly different route over expansive moorland to the Blye water, returning on the east side of the Bochel to the car park. This is a fantastic walk (on a nice day) in the foothills of the Ladder Hills, with excellent visibility.

(NOTE the different date, there is no June walk).

# Sat 6<sup>th</sup> July 2024: Portsoy to Sandend (circular) (9.0km / 5.5m, 130m ascent).

This circular route starts at the old Harbour at Portsoy and follows the cliff path to the headland at Redhythe Point, and on to Sandend Bay, stopping for refreshments at the picnic tables on the beach at Sandend. We will return on a more direct route over the hill at Arnbath and back to Portsoy. We travel on rough, sandy and grassy tracks, passing sea arches and WWII pill boxes on the way.

# Sat 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2024: East Culbin (circular) (12.3km / 6m, 50m ascent).

This circular route starts at the Wellhill car park on the East side of Culbin Forest near Forres and is on wide forest tracks throughout. We walk NE from the car park to Findhorn Bay, stopping for refreshments overlooking Findhorn, before returning via the coast at Buckie Loch. We may go off piste on the way - bring a compass!

# Sat 7<sup>th</sup> September 2024: Whiteash Woods circular (6.7km /4.2m, 220m ascent).

This route is shorter than normal but has a greater ascent than normal. We will start at the main Forestry car park about 1km East of Fochabers on the A98, passing Longhowe Loch, the Duchess of Richmond's Pyramid, Ranald's Grave and Peep's View. If the weather is nice, there should be some excellent views on the way.

As spring blooms around us, we're excited to be starting our first full growing season at the Aberlour Community Garden. Here's what's been happening and what's on the horizon:



March was a busy month and saw the Village Council hosting a free Soup and Sweet lunch for village residents aged over 60. It was lovely to host 50 guests and we are grateful to everyone who donated food or helped at the lunch.

Also in March, the annual Strathdee Sponsored Bottle Bingo in the hall raised £1849 and we are indebted to Strathdee Properties for continuing to sponsor the event. Thanks are also due to the volunteers and all those who came along to play bingo.

Our next fundraising event will be a Quiz Night in the village hall on Friday 6 September 2024.
