

## Friends,

As I write this it's not yet feeling too close to Christmas - the fireworks displays are yet to finish- but no doubt we'll be surrounded by the joys of Christmas music and advertising, and I'd imagine certainly by the time this comes through your door.

One of my favourite things about Christmas time isn't actually so much the day itself, as the run-up for it. And for me, not so much the preparation and the advertising-fest and the pressures around presents, but that there is a time leading up to it that is set aside.

I recently learned of a Mexican advent tradition of the *Posada*, which means 'inn.' It's a tradition recalling the journey to Bethlehem that first Christmas, where figurines of Mary and Joseph (and sometimes the donkey! – though there wasn't actually a donkey mentioned in the bible...) go from home to home over the days of advent. It connects everyone whose home is part of the *posada* into the journey towards Christmas. There's something about being wrapped up in the story and the wonder *together*, and the themes of hospitality and giving the figurine Mary and Joseph 'somewhere to stay', that I think is beautiful and resonates with the heart of the Christmas story.

We live in an era where the number of people who - a bit like Mary and Joseph - are 'on the move' is at a record high. Except these are people forced from their homes through violence, political oppression, or climate change. The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) reports that at the end of 2020 there were worldwide 82.4million people living in forced displacement. That was double the number in 2010. And it is a number that has grown since - well over the equivalent of the entire population of the UK.

In this world, it is a healthy reminder that right at the heart of the Christmas story is a family who were displaced and forced to be on the move. Jesus, being born into such circumstances, shows us that God is present to those who know the hardest and harshest of human experiences, and that God's care and love is for those people.

The miracle of Christmas - the coming of God's messiah upon earth in Jesus Christ - is itself set against the darkness of the world. Into our world - with all its pain, and struggles, and conflicts, and cynicism - came a child who gave healing and comfort and peace and hope. And the promise of that hope serves us well in dark months and dark times. For those of us claiming Christian faith, the determination to hope is underpinned by the promise of the Christ. We are those who cling to the words in John's gospel: In him was life, and that life was the light of all peoples. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.

If Christmas comes as a season that is complex or difficult for you, let me make you aware and invite you to the Bittersweet service on the 13<sup>th</sup> December (more details below) - it is a relaxed and informal service that gives space to face the Christmas season with the authentic emotions we carry, including the difficult ones. Whatever this season looks like for you, may you know hope and peace and every blessing of Christmas.

# Aberlour Walking Group - Winter 2024/5 Walks

Welcome to our 2024/2025 Winter walks. Aberlour Walking Group is open to everybody in the community and any visitors. Our aim is to combine walking with an opportunity to meet and chat with other walkers, and to introduce walkers to some new areas. Children and dogs are welcome - under adult supervision. We usually stop for a tea/coffee en route, so please bring a flask and wear walking boots or strong shoes. Come ready to start the walks at 10:00 a.m. If you need more information, help with transport, or to confirm that you are joining a walk, please contact Donald (details below) or use our WhatsApp group (which includes all walk details).

# <u>Sat 7<sup>th</sup> December 2024: Speyside Way from Craigellachie (circular)</u> (5km / 3.0m).

We will have a short local walk from Craigellachie Telford Bridge car park, route dependant on the weather. We will arrange a Christmas soup and sandwich lunch at Craigellachie Church Hall at the end of the walk.

<u>Sat 4<sup>th</sup> January 2025: Aberlour circular via Glenallachie (7km / 4m)</u>
Another local walk... We will walk from Aberlour Church along the Speyside Way to Delmore Farm, take the wide track to Kinnermony, cross the A95 and proceed to Glenallachie. Then we follow the Lour Burn to the Linn falls, and take the path back to Aberlour.

Sat 8th February 2025: Quarrel Wood Circular (8.5km / 5.0m)

Park in the "Woodland Park" (Leggat Car Park) just off the A96 (3km / 2m)

West of Elgin. This is a circular woodland walk which will take you through
forest and sandstone quarries, giving great views to the North to the
area occupied by the medieval Spynie Loch. The path has some rough
sections in places. There are opportunities to provide Shorter Walks.

# Sat 8<sup>th</sup> March 2025: Cragganmore to Scoot More (circular) (10.7km / 6.7m, 210m ascent).

This circular route starts at the Ballindalloch Station Car Park (Cragganmore). We will follow the tarmac road East to above Blacksboat Station and take a circular forest track round Scoot More, before returning along the old railway line to Cragganmore. Shorter options available starting at Blacksboat Station.



# Leasing of Glebe Field



This year the tea room has taken over the running costs of the toilets, with many excellent comments about the cleanliness of them, so a big shout out to the volunteers who help maintain the toilets.

#### SPEYSIDE COMMUNITY CAR SHARING SCHEME

What a year this has been for the Car Share as we celebrate 20 years of being a registered charity. It's hard to believe how far we've come from having 50 members at the end of the first year to now helping over 500 members with their journeys. We are pleased that our members are making more social visits now and are able to enjoy trips out to the shops, hairdressers and social clubs as well as getting to their medically related appointments.

We took the opportunity to send out questionnaires to our members recently and the feedback we have had has been amazing, demonstrating how much the Car Share means to our members and how grateful they are to our volunteers. One member told us "Without the Car Sharing Scheme I'd be unable to attend my medical appointments. The telephonists are friendly and helpful, likewise the drivers. I spend a lot of time on my own so it's nice to be able to have a chat. With some cars it takes me time to get in but the drivers are very patient. I'd be lost without you so well done to you all. You all deserve a medal for your time and effort. Please keep up the good work."

We can only operate with the generous financial support we get and through the willingness of our volunteers to give up their time to help those in their local community. In November we brought our volunteers together for our annual social event, which gave us the opportunity to share the feedback from our members and recognise the invaluable support our volunteers give. We currently have a total of 30 volunteers (Committee Members, Telephonists and Drivers). However, we are really keen to welcome more drivers to our team as it is more efficient and cost effective for us to use a driver as close as possible to the member. It's a very flexible way of volunteering as we don't ask for any regular commitment from our drivers and they give whatever time they can spare - even an hour or so every now and again is a huge help to us. If driving isn't for you then why not volunteer as a Telephonist? All we ask is that you are at home one day a week and would be willing to take calls from our members to help organise their journeys. This could be on a fixed day each week or simply helping out to cover holidays or illness on a day you're free. You don't need any equipment just access to a phone (landline or mobile) and I just divert the calls to your number.

You will hopefully have seen us out and about over the summer months at the local games where we had the chance to speak to many of our existing members and gained a few new ones. Thank you to everyone who bought raffles from us on the day, and also to those who supported us with our 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Prize Draw which raised an unbelievable £3,250!

## SCIO CRAIGELLACHIE VILLAGE COUNCIL SCO18399

Plans are underway for our regular fundraising Christmas Bingo on Friday 6 December 2024; eyes down at 7.30pm. Funds raised will be used for the upkeep and maintenance of the village hall, playing field, tennis courts, tennis pavilion and Christmas Lights.

We successfully applied for funding from the Co-op Local Community Fund to create a woodland in a neglected area of the playing field, which will increase plant bio-diversity and encourage wildlife into a seldom visited part of the field. We were disappointed to see potholes in the recently resurfaced Fiddich Park car park getting bigger, and hope they will be repaired before they get any worse. A gate prohibiting entry from the carpark to the Speyside Way is scheduled to be installed very soon.

Drivers leaving the village on the A95 towards the A941, are finding the higher safety barrier on the Craigellachie road bridge impacts on the line of sight for traffic coming from the Rothes direction. The worn out white lines and chevrons at junctions are also a road safety concern and both issues have been reported to Moray Council and Amey.

The Rev Andrew Kimmitt led an Act of Remembrance at the Craigellachie War Memorial. Several wreaths were laid, at the memorial, including one on behalf of Craigellachie Village Council.
