

#### Friends,

When I first arrived in Aberlour five years ago, we were in the strange days of Covid restrictions. Most of you first "met" me through a camera lens or printed sheets on doorsteps. Worship looked nothing like what any of us were used to. And yet, even then, there was a warmth and a sense of community that made something very unusual still somehow feel like the beginning of something special. Over the years since, this place has become home to us - surrounded by a community and church family, while our own family has grown too.

It was therefore with mixed emotion that I shared the news with the congregation that I have accepted a call to serve as Chaplain at HMP Glenochil in Clackmannanshire, and will, with the permission of Presbytery, demit my charge here in the new year. My final Sunday is expected to be the 4th of January. There is still time — and we will walk it together, this is not goodbye yet - but I wanted to say as the news filters out, to mark the depth of appreciation and affection I feel.

We love this place, and this community. It has been, quite simply, a privilege to serve as your minister. But when the unexpected opportunity came, after much prayer and discernment, I sensed a something I could not ignore. Those who were there when I told the congregation heard me speak of the Jesus who, in the Gospels says to the first disciples, "Follow me," and also "Come and see." That combination — trust, and willingness to step toward where Christ already is — has shaped my reflection, and it is shaping this next step too. There is excitement and hope in that. And there is sorrow as well, because saying yes to one thing always means letting go of something else precious.

In the meantime, we have the rest of the year yet. There are conversations ahead, and time to support one another through this transition. And I believe — with conviction — that the future of this congregation is held in God's good keeping. The gifts, faith, and love that fill this community do not depend on any one person. They remain. And God, who has been faithful, will continue to be faithful.

We also still have Advent and Christmas to share. These coming weeks will bring moments that remind us of the Christmas miracle which is a truth for all days — as light begins to grow in the darkness, as we sing words of hope and wonder, and as we gather around the story that tells us God is with us. I can't think of a better season to spend together before the next chapter begins.



#### Aberlour Walking Group Winter 2025/2026 Walks

Welcome to our 2025/2026 Winter walks. Aberlour Walking Group is open to everybody in the community and any visitors. Our aim is to combine walking with an opportunity to meet and chat with other walkers, and to introduce walkers to some new areas. Children and dogs are welcome - under adult supervision. We usually stop for a tea/coffee en route, so please bring a flask and wear walking boots or strong shoes. Come ready to start the walks at 10am If you need more information, help with transport, or to confirm that you are joining a walk, please contact Donald (details below) or use our WhatsApp group (which includes all walk details).

## <u>Sat 6<sup>th</sup> December 2025: Speyside Way from Craigellachie (circular)</u> (5km / 3.0m).

We will have a short local walk from Craigellachie Telford Bridge car park, route dependant on the weather. We will finish with tea/coffee and homebakes at Craigellachie Church Hall at the end of the walk.

#### Sat 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2026: Aberlour via Glenallachie (circular) (7km / 4m)

Another local walk... We will walk from Aberlour Church along the Speyside Way to Delmore Farm, take the wide track to Kinnermony, cross the A95 and proceed to Glenallachie. Then we follow the Lour Burn to the Linn falls, and take the path back to Aberlour. Soup, refreshments and homebakes in the Church at the end.

#### Sat 7th February 2026: Aldroughty Wood (circular) (9.5km / 5.8m)

This is a new one for us... We will park close to the Eight Acres Hotel on the West edge of Elgin, and cross the A96 into the Aldroughty Woods Park. This a circular woodland walk on varied surfaces from tarmac to a soft bed of beech leaves.

### <u>Sat 14<sup>th</sup> March 2026: Lhanbryde to Mosstodloch (linear) (9km / 5.5m, 50m ascent).</u>

Starting in Lhanbryde, we walk on paths through Loch Na Bo estate, passing kettle lochs, then Blackburn and the old Orbliston station. A minor road then takes us to Balnacoul Wood, where we follow a path to Mosstodloch. This is a mainly level walk - a favourite from the past.

There have been many big successes in 2025. While our pond; fruit cage; potting shed; increased number of beds (including raised beds); tunnels; and benches form a very visible physical sign of our development, there are many less visible signs.

Our close relationship with Speyside High, Aberlour Primary, Craigellachie Primary and the local Nursery means there is hardly a day without involvement with young people. Recent "work parties' assisting with bulb planting, will provide a very visible sign of their involvement in the spring. A big thank you to everyone who decorated our garden with "tattie bogles". The pumpkin carving day proved a big success: the polycarbonate was transformed by Jim, who arranged a carving session and a lighting up session in the evening.

Our increased footprint has brought an increasing number of visitors to the garden, establishing the Glebe Garden as a major community hub in Aberlour. We are working to develop several raised beds and paths to improve our accessibility in 2026.

We are indebted to everyone who has made donations – small personal donations pooled together make large donations. Since the last Kirk News we have also received large donations from the Aberlour Fire Station and Wm Grant employees – thank you.

Our dedicated band of volunteers is growing, and we hope to be able to provide more opportunities in the early evenings and weekends in 2026. At the AGM in October, Amanda Shaw stood down from the Steering Board and Graeme Findlay joined the team – thank you Amanda, and welcome Graeme.

Have a peaceful Christmas – please remember to ask Santa for some boots, gloves and overalls so you can join us digging, pruning, growing and relaxing in our wonderful environment in 2026.

Our evening walks stopped just before the clocks changed at the end of October, but the afternoon walks are continuing and we have been enjoying the fabulous autumn colours down by the river and along the Speyside Way.

We meet every Tuesday at 2pm by the War Memorial in the square, and return to there by 3pm. Our aim is to have a sociable hour with plenty of chat and a bit of fresh air and exercise.

Health Walks are open to everyone, whatever your walking ability, so please come along and give it a go. To ensure everyone's safety we ask that no dogs are brought to the health walks.

By the time you read this article we will have had our AGM, and hopefully be looking forward to working with some additional members of the community. Meantime, we have been advised the repairs to the Dufftown A941 road, near the corner above Craigellachie Hotel, have been delayed due to the work having to be put out to tender.

CHP Biomass helped clear growth and shrubbery at the old roadway at Craigellachie Telford Bridge and also tidied the tangled vegetation from the sloped area next to the tennis courts. The specialist equipment used meant the work was completed in a few hours and has made a huge difference. We are very grateful for the support of CHP Biomass.

The Christmas lights in the village look beautiful every year, however it does cost a considerable amount to maintain the lights, plus we have to pay to have the lights on Victoria Street (A95) erected and dismantled. Fortunately, we were delighted to be awarded £1,000 from Rothes Windfarm to assist with Christmas lights expenditure. Our recent appeal for volunteer assistance with traffic management on the Dufftown Road during erection and dismantling the Christmas lights, and also to assist with associated paperwork, resulted in several people coming forward to help out, which was wonderful and ensured the Christmas lights will be shining again this year. A massive thank you to everyone who offered to help out.

We are looking into the possibility of relocating the Craigellachie War Memorial from the grounds of Craigellachie Church to the village hall carpark. This will be quite a logistical challenge and will be a costly project. If you are aware of any organisation that might be able to financially support the relocation of the memorial, please do let us know.

At the time of writing this article, we believe 20mph signs will be erected on the A95 at Victoria Street, Craigellachie. We are also awaiting the results of a Moray Council consultation regarding a 20mph zone on Hill Street & Edward Avenue (Dufftown Road).

Friday 5 December 2025, Bottle Bingo, generously sponsored by Strathdee Properties.

Friday 13 March 2026, Prize Bingo.
