Will you help someone like Fridah to grow food and protect their children from hunger?

Fridah lives in a corrugated metal shelter in the sprawling yet densely packed informal settlement of Dagoretti, Nairobi, with her 13yr old twins, her daughter and grandson. There's no running water and only shared toilet facilities. The community is forced to live precariously day to day.

Secure jobs are hard to find, and most people earn less than a dollar a day, meaning buying food to feed your children is a constant struggle. With rent, water, school and medicine to pay for too, some days there just isn't enough money for a meal. Aching hunger compounds relentless stress.

Thankfully, seeds of change are being planted in the heart of Dagoretti. Christian Aid's trusted partner, Beacon of Hope, is supporting parents to find security, and nurture hope, through urban farming. Beacon of Hope offers residents the opportunity to train as urban farmers with skills, seeds, tools and space-efficient plots to grow produce near their homes. Parents like Fridah are turning the tide on urban poverty and learning to manage pests, produce compost, cultivate seeds, and take their own produce to market.

Christian Aid and its supporters are joining together once again during Christian Aid Week (10-16 May) to fundraise in all kinds of ways. With 7 days to make a difference, every gift, act and prayer counts.

Will you help support aspiring urban farmers to access the tools and training they need to grow a better future?

2026 Summer Walks



Welcome to our 2026 Summer walks. Aberlour Walking Group is open to everybody in the community and any visitors. Our aim is to combine walking with an opportunity to meet and chat with other walkers, and to introduce walkers to some new areas. Children and dogs are welcome - under adult supervision. We usually stop for a tea/coffee *en route*, so please bring a flask and wear walking boots or strong shoes. Come ready to start the walks at 10:00 a.m. If you need more information, help with transport, or to confirm that you are joining a walk, please contact Donald (details below) or use our WhatsApp group (which includes all walk details).

Sat 9th May 2026: Archiestown to Cairn Cattoch (circular) (9.5km / 6m, 160m ascent).

Starting at the square in Archiestown, we follow forest tracks and paths due North from Archiestown, to the saddle between Hunt Hill and Cairn Cattoch (our destination). We return West and then South re-joining the track back to Archiestown. Excellent views of Ben Rinnes, the surrounding forest and the wind farm. A new walk for us.

Sat 6th June 2026: Roseisle to Findhorn (linear) (9.7km / 6.0m, 14m ascent).

A NEW WALK - We will start from the main Roseisle car park, walking on forest tracks to the South West corner of Roseisle forest. We then follow the coastal strip path round Burghead Bay. Just after Kinloss Airfield, we walk inland from the coast through Findhorn dunes, returning back to the coast to walk round the split at the mouth of Findhorn Bay.

Sat 11th July 2026: Aberlour / Dufftown area - TBC

Sat 1st August 2026: Tomintoul to The Clash (linear)

(10.92km / 6.79m, 369m)

A NEW WALK, and more physical than normal. We follow the Speyside Way track from Campdalemore Wood Car park (just West of Tomintoul), over Carn Daimh (with 360 degree spectacular views) to The Clash Wood car park (just West of Tomnavoulin).

Sat 12th September 2026: Cullen - Portknockie Circular (via Fiddle Bow Rock) (8km / 5m)

A popular walk (especially in the sun). Meet in the Square in Cullen (NJ 513 671). We will walk across the viaduct from Cullen and proceed above Cullen Bay to Portknockie. We will pass Bow Fiddle Rock, take steps down to beach, and follow the beach back to Cullen. A lovely walk especially in good weather!

The New Year started badly at the village hall when the ceiling of the Jebb Room was damaged and part of the lath and plaster fell down, causing inconvenience to our various hall user groups. Thanks to a variety of tradespeople, we were able to have the ceiling repaired fairly quickly and groups have resumed. Thank you to our hall user groups for their patience during the upheaval.

We are making slow progress on the issue of flooding through the village, however we will continue to raise the issue until the problems are resolved.

Unfortunately, despite the introduction of new arrangements in mid November 2025, we are still no further forward with clarity regarding the snow clearing service arrangements for Craigellachie Primary School.

In early March the Craigellachie Village Council hosted a Soup & Sweet Lunch for nearly 50 residents of Craigellachie, aged over 60, in the village hall. The Senior Citizens' lunch was first instigated following the demise of the Craigellachie Senior Citizen Group. The Group donated their remaining funds to the Village Council, who then decided to organise an annual lunch for the older members of our community. The lunch is an opportunity for a social gathering and a way of thanking the senior citizens for their support of village events throughout the year.

We held our popular Tea and Competitions evening in March 2026. Grateful thanks to our main sponsor Highland Broadband and to everyone who donated prizes or raffles, which really does make such a difference. Thank you to the volunteers who continue to make our fundraising events a success and also to those who come along and participate in the fun.

Also in March, we hosted "Just Like That - the Tommy Cooper Show". This Tribute Act was a new type of community event for us and we are grateful to Wm Grant & Son Glenfiddich Distillery for financial support. We had a full hall and everyone who came along had an enjoyable evening.

We have raised our concerns regarding Moray Council's policy of withdrawing the school bus service from the young people of Craigellachie. The policy states the Speyside Way, which has no lighting provision, is a suitable route for children, some as young as 11, to walk to and from Speyside High School. Pupils would need to set off from Craigellachie at 7.30am in the morning and then do the return journey at the end of the school day. Of particular concern is having to trek during the dark winter months and when the Speyside Way becomes treacherous following snowfall and freeze/thaw. We hope this decision will be reconsidered by the local authority.

In April the Village Council organised a Litter Pick and a considerable number of rubbish bags were filled with various items collected from around the village. Some of the litter probably originated from pink bins which had blown over during storms and we would ask householders to try and ensure their bins are securely stored to avoid further spillages. Grateful thanks to all those, young and not so young, who took part in the litter pick. Let's all do our best to keep our village looking tidy and free of litter!

We will again be planting summer bedding displays around the village. If you can spare a couple of hours to help plant an area, or perhaps join a rota for watering plants, then please, please get in touch. Sharing the load with more people will mean less work for everyone.
